



We have used squares and rectangles to make pictures in the style of the artist Mondrian. We used







We have been doing tests this week so there aren't many interesting photos from our class work! However, we all enjoyed letting off steam in the playground.




We have also been doing some science experiments on solids, liquids and gases. We held chocolate in our hands to see if it would melt - we even got to eat some afterwards.
