This week's is from **Askrigg's** log books:

14 September 1984: Most children went to West Burton to see a performance by Harrogate Theatre in Education. Mrs Smith was in charge of the party. The children enjoyed the light hearted entertainment by a cast of two very much. Mrs Joyce Horner, the caretaker, has been told that she must retire on her 65th birthday, which is imminent. Mrs Paula Hague has been appointed to succeed her. A presentation was made to Mrs Horner. She was given some decorative plates and jug which she had chosen and a bouquet and card signed by all the school. 15 September 1915: In spite of the attraction of a travelling circus, the attendance today has improved. The scholars were allowed to leave half an hour earlier this afternoon.
