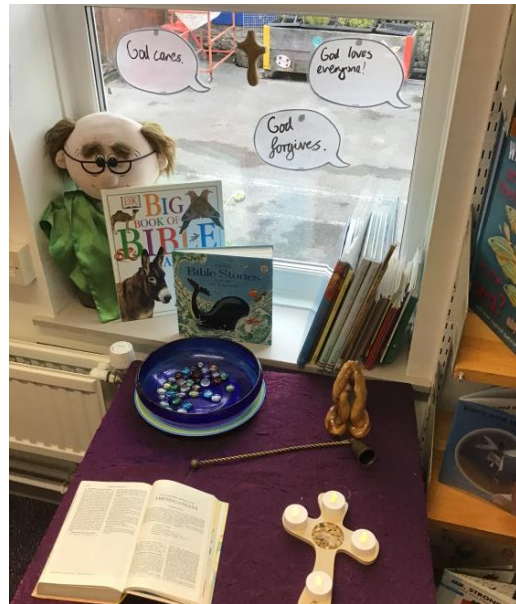

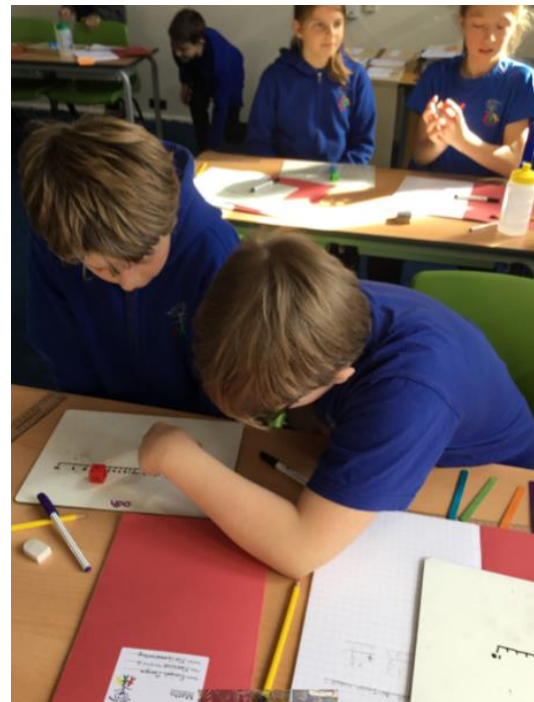


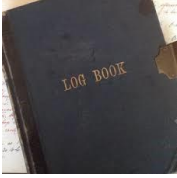
Golden Eagles
