








A very informative time to shine all about water voles.

### **EYFS News column**

We've hardly had time to draw breath this week it has been so full.

We have learnt about the story of Rama and Sita and made little diva lamps to light like Hindus and Sikhs do to celebrate Diwali. We have made some beautiful rangoli patterns too. Then we danced around our lamps and sang. There is a lot of dancing and singing at Diwali just like Christmas, and yes, we have started singing our Christmas songs. Let the celebrations begin!!

In maths we have made recipes in the mud kitchen. What a mes......merising activity that was. We mixed all sorts of thing but the magic ingredient that transforms all the recipes is the water. At one point the pine cones, wheat, grass, mud, sticks etc were all swimming in water. But then we discovered the fun activity of pouring the ingredients into a sieve and collecting the water back to reuse. We had to do this because Mrs. Grumpalump Johnston wouldn't let us have any more water.

Water made quite a presence this week. One lunchtime the heavens opened and before we managed to get inside we were all soaked through – even the grownups. It may seem excessive but after the required amount of clothing removal we may well have to ask you to label socks in future. We have quite a number drying on the radiator and no one seems to know whether they are their socks or not. Feel free to send in a description of missing socks and we will try our best to return them.

We have loved making a quantity of 4 in as many ways as possible. Especially with the green cubes – just like on numberblocks. We also had 4 little moles burrowing in leaves and digging tunnels. (Only in a rhyme so those of you with farming blood need not bring in traps).

Oh and squares and rectangles have been hugely popular during independent learning. We have been drawing around them in various sizes, printing and comparing. Putting them together to make larger shapes and identifying their properties as well as using positional language.

Some of our youngest children were very excited when they came across the automatic hand sanitiser. Given the chance they would have covered themselves in sanitiser and been totally Covid resilient despite the (now strictly forbidden) Early Years practice of licking each other.

I can't really believe we have reached the 20th of November already. Soon the autumn displays will be down and the winter art up.

We hope you are all keeping well and happy in these unusual times and be reassured that school is such a vibrant and joyful place where your children are busy and happily playing with friends no matter how limiting life out of school may be for the adults,
